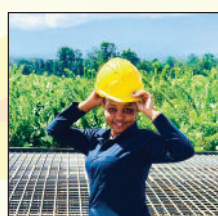

What We Do

One New Education was founded in 2011 to help girls in developing nations obtain access to an education. Political unrest, economic instability, environmental degradation, and many other stressors in these countries lead to hardships that translate into many families living with next to nothing. They often cannot pay for the necessities to send their children to school.

Women in these countries often have children when they are as young as 14 or 15 and by the time they are 20, they have several children and no way to support them.

We believe that one of the critical ingredients to break this pattern is education. Women are the threads that bind together their communities, so an education will benefit not only an individual and her family, but the whole community as well.

How It Works

A student can be from any country. She must be nominated for a scholarship by someone who has met her and can attest to her character and need (a sponsor). Applications can be downloaded in English, Spanish, and French from our website or obtained by contacting us directly.

In addition, each applicant must have a local contact person who can act as a liaison between the student and the foundation. The contact can be the sponsor, a friend of the applicant, or a member of the community in good standing. Funds are provided directly to the school or to the contact person, but not to the recipient or her family.

Recipients must be attending primary or secondary school. They are chosen based on financial need, past academic performance, and a statement they write describing why they would like to receive the scholarship. ONE also provides aid for our secondary school graduates to either attend university, a vocational school, or to start a business. The graduate must fill out a separate application for that scholarship.

Students will be funded annually, providing they attend school regularly and pass their classes, as well as send us their grade reports and letters each year answering questions about their studies and their accomplishments and challenges.
