ANNUAL REPORT, 2024

In 2024 we saw the continuation of several university/post-secondary scholarships: **Belen, Tatiana, and Elizabeth** in Nicaragua, **Bencille** in Haiti, and **Jenifer Joseph, Jennifer Anselm, and Winnie Leonard** in Tanzania. **Michel** in Nicaragua is substitute-teaching until she can be placed in a permanent position and she still loves her chosen career. She also had a baby, which was a surprise, but has made her even more determined to find work. **Jeni Anselm** finished her "diploma" (essentially the same as an associate's degree) and is now studying at the university in Dar es Salaam for her bachelors. **Mercy** is studying in teaching school in Kenya.

Loyda in Guatemala had some health problems that meant she had to leave school, but she is intending to go back to another school when her health problems are resolved. **Thalia** has finished her "basico" and will be entering a small Montessori type school for 2025. She will be studying with hearing students and is very excited and a little nervous. She will have three years of this study.

Linda Maria in Honduras is in 8th grade now and simply shining. She sends all her videos and recordings to us in English. She continues to be on the honor roll and to love school.

In Nicaragua, **Elizabeth** has finished her university classes and her internship. Now she has a year of work for the state before she receives her degree. She simply glows when she's talking about her work. She still loves it and it shows! **Belen** will enter her fourth year of English studies at the university. **Tatiana** continues with her accounting courses at the local vocational school, and she will graduate in 2026, as will Belen. **Emili, Krisbell, and Raquel** all did fantastic in school this year, and were honored for their grades by marching in the annual festival parade.

In Uganda, **Naomi** has taken her national exam to determine which university she can go to, and what she can study. We will find out her grades early in 2025.

Bencille is now in her second year of vocational school for “administrative sciences” in Haiti. **Ahecaina** is consistently at the top of her class in 10th grade, despite the horrors surrounding them every day in Haiti. **Mirielle** is doing well, and we paid for some counseling to help her deal with what happened to her and her family. We also are supporting her in terms of paying for food so she can live with our contact Claudine. Her family is still on the street, and she was going to have to go live there again with them, since it is very expensive for Claudine to pay for food for an extra mouth.

In Nepal, **Amrita** is studying in 11th grade in an excellent school for pharmacy. **Bharosha** passed her national exam after 12th grade, and we are waiting to hear where she would like to go to study medicine. **Khusbu** is studying hard for her national exam after 10th grade and will take it early in the year and **Sumira** is beating everyone at school in running competitions.

We accepted a new student from Nepal. **Kritisha** is now in 4th grade. She came from a community school and at first struggled with a harder education, but she’s improving by leaps and bounds. She’s also just discovered sports and is loving it.

Christa visited the Nicaraguan students in late December of this year.

2024 Noteworthy Foundation Moments

- At the end of 2024, ONE has 23 scholarship recipients, representing eight countries: Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Haiti, Tanzania, Uganda, Nepal, and Kenya. Eight of these scholarships are for post-secondary study, be that university, vocational school or teaching college. We are waiting to hear about the continuing studies of two of our students.
- Our online fundraiser during the month of March raised a bit over \$6200. In addition, on April 28 we once again held the Global Market for Girls’ Education fundraiser in person at Heritage Square in downtown Flagstaff. We had several wonderful music and dance performances and lots of student art for sale from several Flagstaff schools. We raised slightly more than \$2,200 from that fundraiser.
- ONE received \$2,500 from the 1% For the People grant from Flagstaff company Kahtoola for the eighth year in a row. This money helps support Bharosha, Amrita, Sumira, Kritisha, and Khusbu in Nepal. We are very grateful for Kahtoola’s help, as this allows us to help other students.
- We also received a one-time donation of \$20,000 from a friend whose bone marrow donor asked him to pay it forward to a good cause. We are delighted to be that good cause!

- Between fundraisers, grants, and individual donations, the foundation brought in \$47,532.69 in 2024. Once again, more than 85% of our total budget went directly to our students or for student-related costs this year.
